<u>I Am Not A Monster: Schizophrenia</u> | <u>Cecilia McGough</u> | <u>TEDxPSU - YouTube</u> — A talk from Cecilia McGough challenging the stigma that still persists within mental health and specifically Schizophrenia.

How Reliable Is Your Memory? Dr. Elizabeth (Beth) Loftus - TED Talk on False Memories - YouTube Dr Elizabeth Loftus discusses how our memories are reconstructed and can be affected by 'false memories'. This can have huge implications within the Criminal Justice System where eye-witness-testimony is used as evidence in court.

<u>The new era of positive psychology | Martin Seligman - YouTube</u> – A Talk from Martin Seligman about the new era of 'Positive Psychology' and how this differs from 'Traditional' Psychology.

<u>Crime and violence: The biological behind murder - YouTube</u>- Professor Adrian Raine discusses the Biological indicators, such as genetics and brain abnormality, which may make an individual more likely to be a violent offender/psychopath.
